BLENDING SOUNDS TO READ WORDS

Step 1 – Spot the ‘Special Friends’

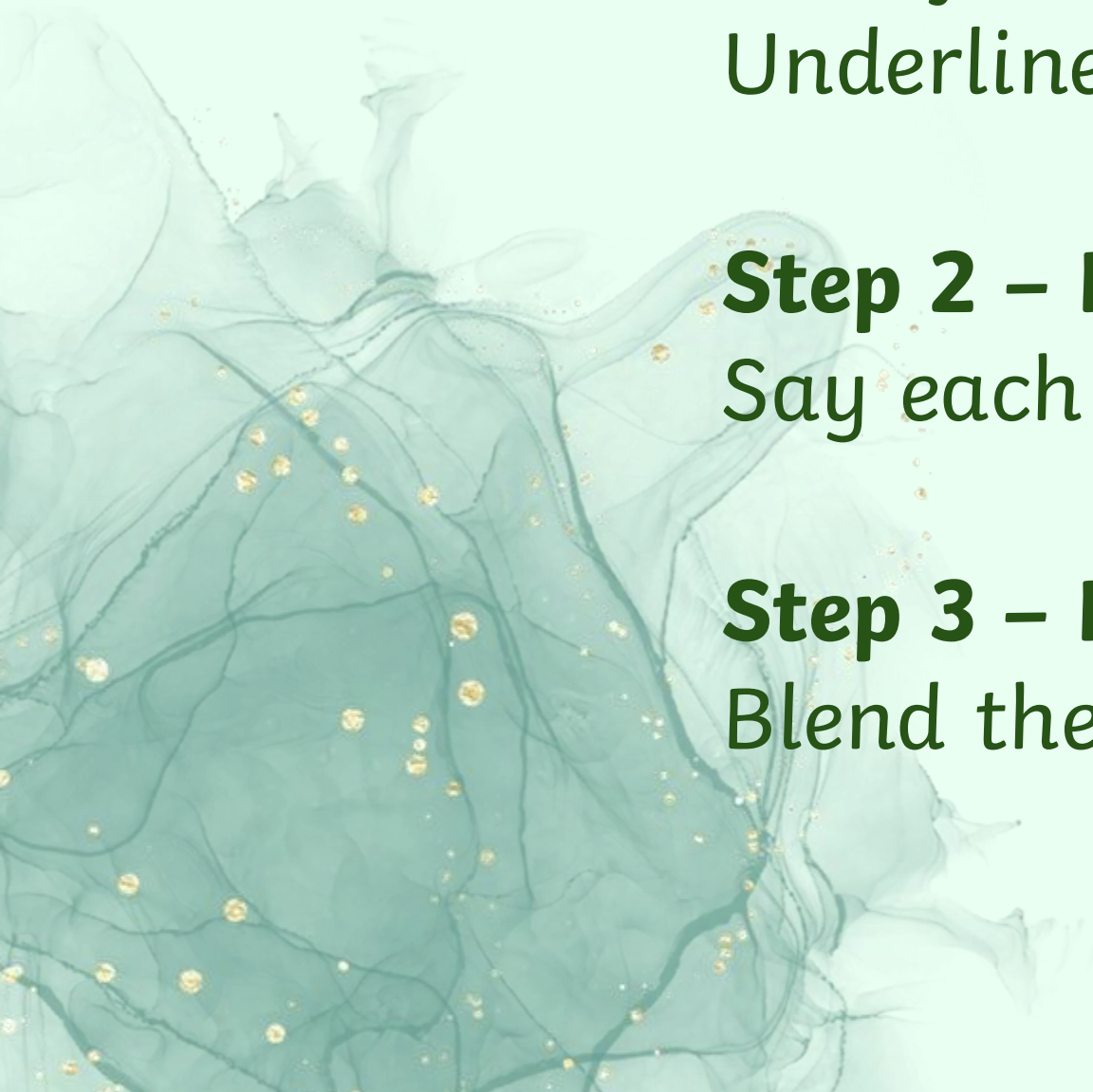
Look for two or more letters that make one sound.
Underline them if needed.

Step 2 – Fred Talk

Say each sound in the word separately.

Step 3 – Read the Word

Blend the sounds together to read the full word.

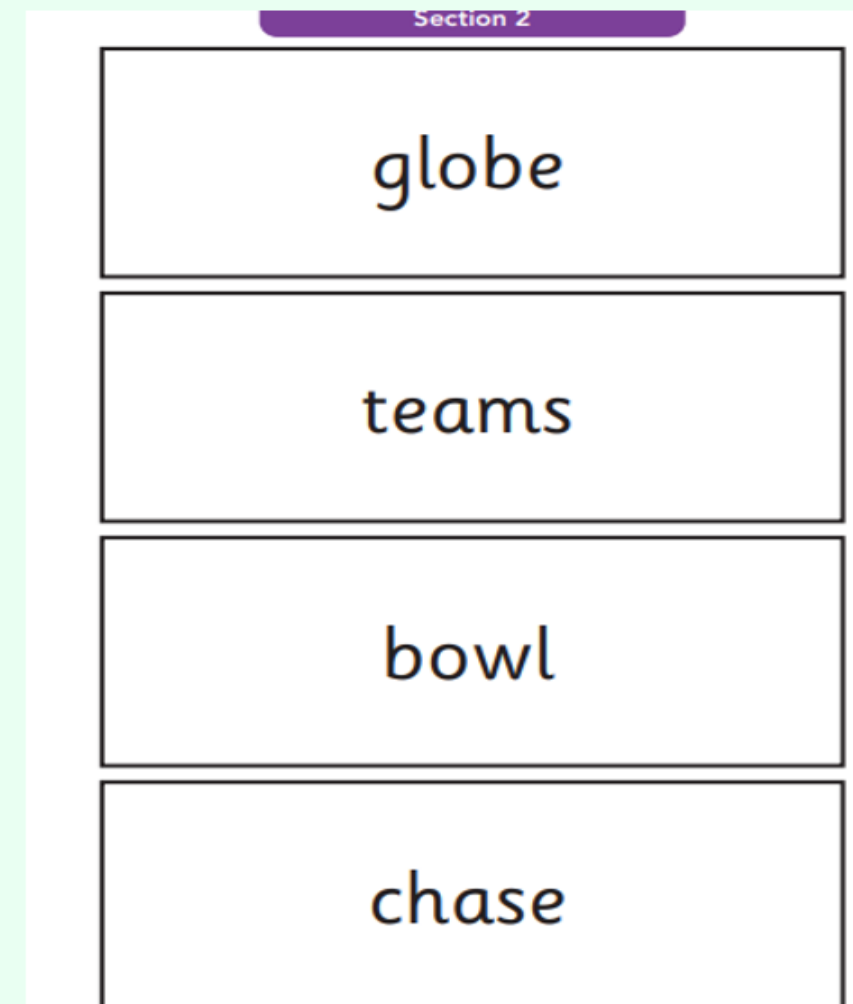
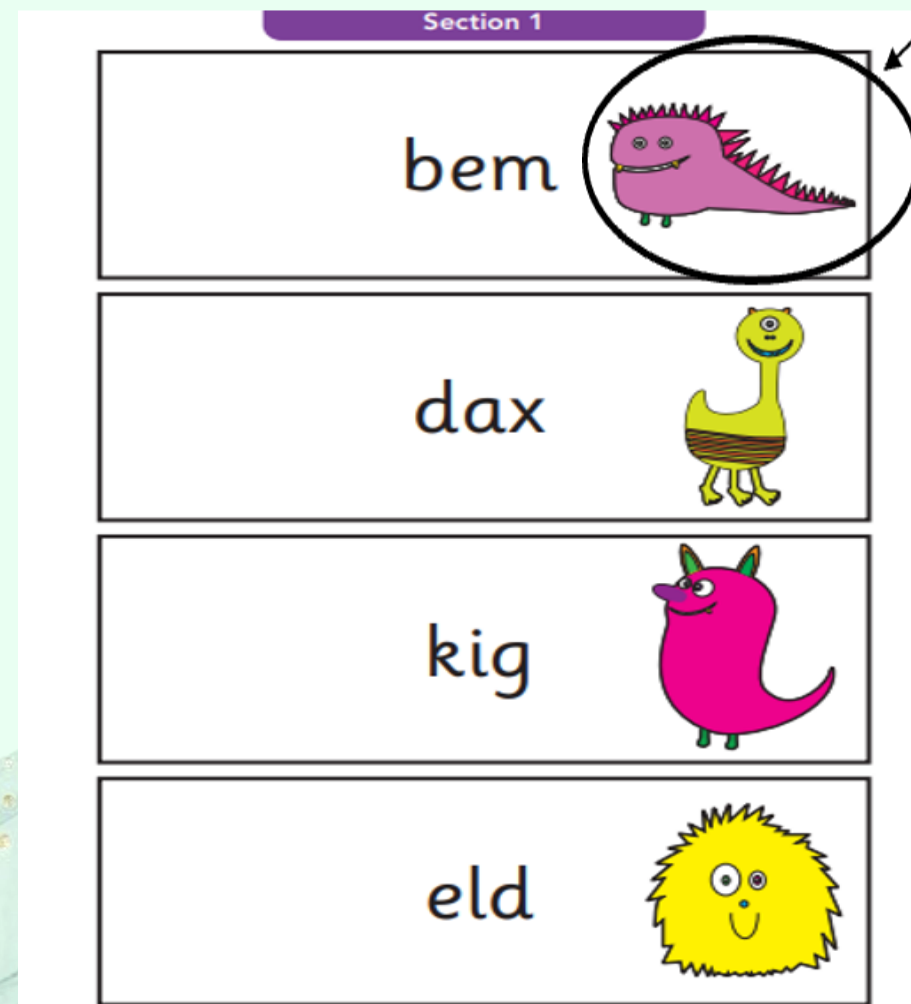


WHAT IS THE PHONICS SCREENING CHECK?

- Statutory assessment that all Year 1 pupils have to complete
- Children in Year 2 who did not pass will retake the check
- The check will be administered in June
- It is made up of 40 words – 20 real, 20 alien words
- Checks that children in Year 1 can sound out and blend words accurately
- Pass mark has been 32/40 for the past few years

EXAMPLE

Children know this means
it is not a real word



- Alien words are nonsense or pseudo words that check children are able to decode words accurately
- Alien picture next to the word
- Different pronunciations of sounds that we have learnt are accepted (as long as it does not make the word real)
- E.g. n-e-s-k or n-ee-s-k would be acceptable

HOW WILL WE ADMINISTER THE CHECK?

- Children are told they will be doing a phonics quiz
- They will sit 1:1 with a familiar adult to complete the check in a comfortable environment
- The check usually takes between 3-5 minutes
- Children will be asked to read the words and will be told that they need to sound out and blend each word out loud rather than in their head – this ensures accuracy

ADAPTATIONS

- In order to support your child, we can chop up the Phonics Screening Check to break it down into more manageable chunks
- Rest breaks
- Change of font or text size
- A quiet environment with a familiar adult
- Children are allowed to add their own sound buttons to words to identify special friends



SOUND BUTTONS

Dot = single sound

Line = digraph or trigraph

Curved line = split digraph

AREAS TO BE MINDFUL OF

- When practising at home, ensure your child is sounding out and blending aloud when they are uncertain of a word
- Some children 'correct' alien words e.g. strom -> storm
- Ensuring your child knows that when it's an alien word, it will not be a real word they have heard of before
- Words with -s on the end – some children accidentally miss this sound from the end

HOW TO SUPPORT AT HOME

- Daily reading at home
- Practising reading sounds using the flashcards or sound mats
- Ensuring your child knows how to identify special friends in words and add sound buttons
- Encouraging sound talking and blending
- Practise reading alien words
- Playing games or apps – Time for Phonics, Phonics Play and Phonics Bloom have lots of free games to play
- When reading words, point to each sound and sweep underneath to show blending
- Lots of praise!

HOW TO SUPPORT AT HOME



Phonics works best when children are given plenty of encouragement and learn to enjoy reading and books. Parents play a very important part in helping with this. Some simple steps to help your child learn to read through phonics:

Step 1 – Spot the ‘Special Friends’

Look for two or more letters that make one sound.
Underline them if needed.

Step 2 – Fred Talk

Say each sound in the word separately.

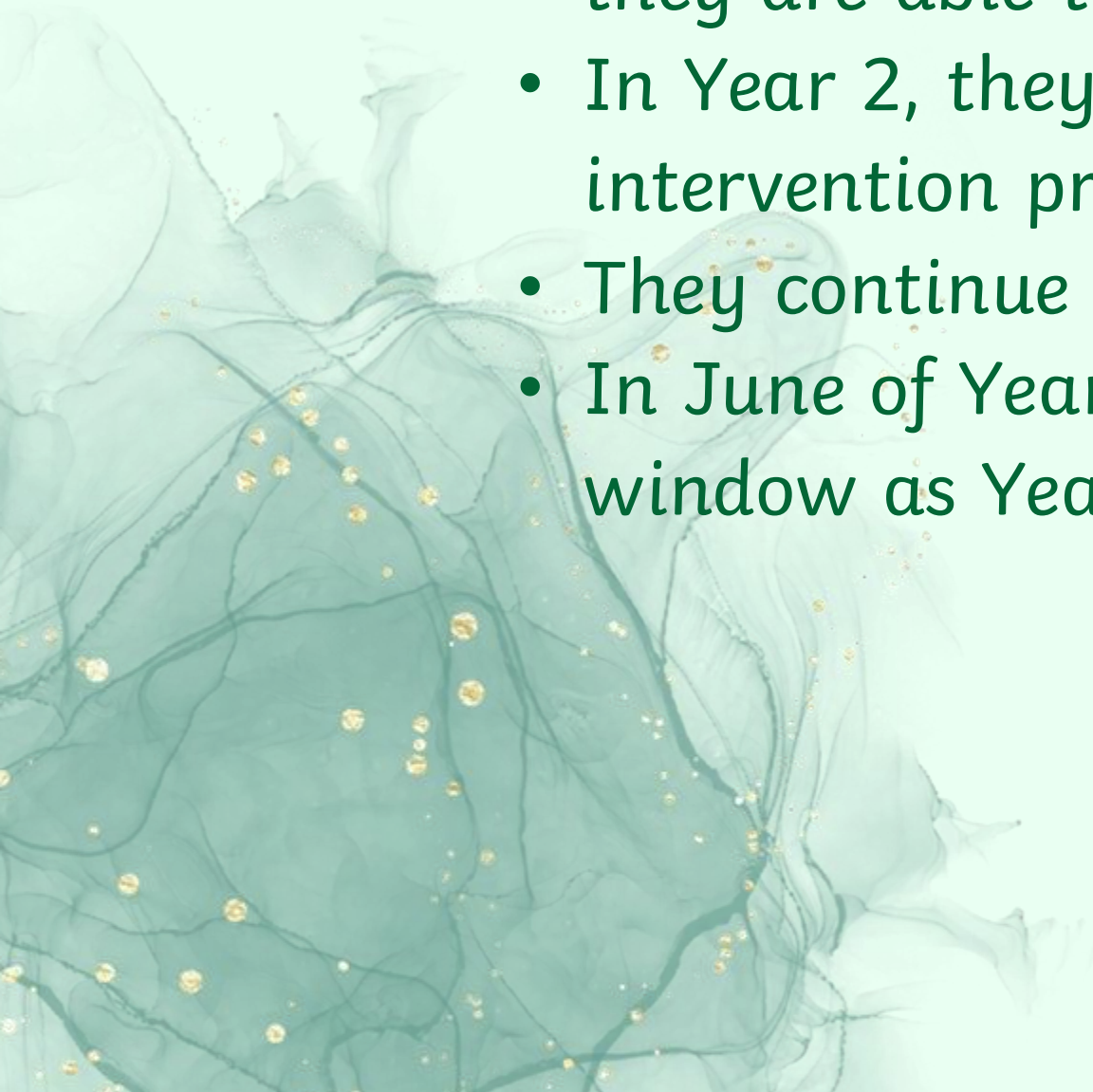
Step 3 – Read the Word

Blend the sounds together to read the full word.



WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CHILD DOES NOT PASS?

- Your child's class teacher will inform you if they do not pass
- They will continue to receive daily phonics interventions to ensure they are able to confidently read
- In Year 2, they will receive support with phonics on our intervention programme with a trained adult
- They continue to read our decodable books
- In June of Year 2, they will retake the check in the same time window as Year 1
